Ensure that carpark is out of bounds. Warn students not to feed animals and to be wary of swooping birds. Inform supervising teachers of the risk and inform students that the BBQ areas are out of bounds. Teachers to supervise students to ensure they heed instructions.	
Bushwalk & fieldwork	PHYSICAL INJURY - Snake bites / stings, mild allergies, sprains, cuts, broken limbs from hazards such as, slippery rocks Being separated from group Exhaustion, dehydration, exposure Known medical conditions (severe allergies, diabetes, asthma) Bushfire Risk / Caught In Fire	DEEC staff are familiar with the field study sites and terrain and schedule regular checks on group numbers. DEEC staff hold current First Aid Training and carry a fully maintained first aid kit DEEC staff will issue clear and concise instructions on safety and, with the support of participating teachers, ensure these instructions are followed. Slippery Rocks: Students will not be allowed to walk along rocks in creek near look out when they are wet after rain. Stinging Trees and Nettles: To be identified to students when in the vicinity with clear warnings. DEEC staff will provide the schools' supervising teachers with a safety information sheet (phone numbers, first aid). The Supervision ratio will not exceed 1:15. DEEC staff implement and follow 'Lost Child EMP' if separation occurs. Excursion to be postponed in extreme weather conditions. The School must ensure students bring water bottles and wear sunscreen and appropriate bushwalking clothing (hats, covered footwear, raincoat). NO DRINKING WATER AVAILABLE ON SITE. Students warned not to fill bottles with tap water in toilets. Ensure all food is kept in shade as much as possible Visiting teachers will provide DEEC staff with a completed 'Participant Safety Notification' form. Visiting teachers must ensure students carry and take own medication and are responsible for monitoring these students DEEC staff will check rural firebrigade bushfire alert website and check with National Parks office that the park is open. In the event of fire ring National Parks Office Alstonville Ph 66270200. Check the direction of the fire and depart in opposite direction along Night Cap Range forest road. If departure is not possible seek refuge in creek at Minyon (away from Tea Tree and overhanging branches) Seek refuge in clearing at Rummery Park Campground near creek).

Falls Extension	track to bottom	Students to walk in a line following behind the DEEC teacher. Ensure there is adequate supervision evenly spaced along line to assist students up the rocks. Students will be advised about three point climbing i.e three parts of the body to be on the rock at all times.
